

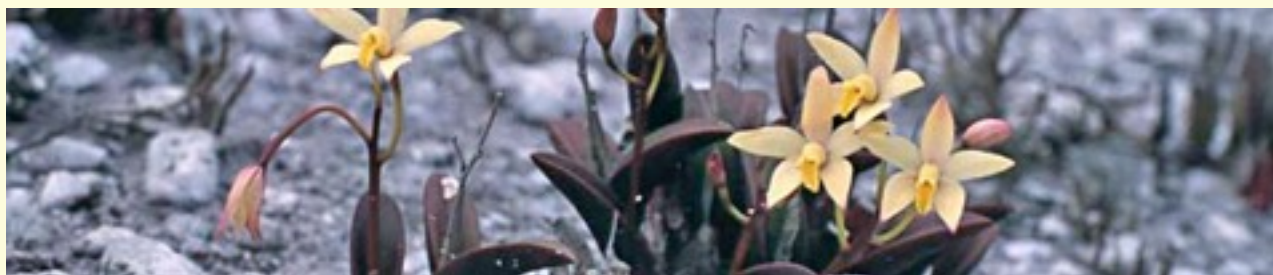

The Sarasota Orchid Society is fortunate to have **Francisco Miranda**, a taxonomist, naturalist and orchid grower, as our featured Speaker during our February Meeting. He was born in Rio de Janeiro in 1956, received his degree in Biology and began his taxonomic studies in the orchid family in 1981. During the next 4 years, he lived most of the time in Manaus where he studied Amazon orchids and began his Master's Degree. Shortly after returning to Rio de Janeiro, the Master's was completed on "*section Cattleyodes of the genus Laelia.*" Since then, his main interest has been on the Brazilian laelias and cattleyas. He is the author of two books and of several papers ranging from species descriptions to subjects of growers' interest in Brazilian, German and U.S. publications. Since 2000, he lives in Haines City, Florida with his wife Cristina, where they have Miranda Orchids, a continuation of Boa Vista Orchids, a nursery they ran in Brazil from 1986 until their move to the USA. Many of the plants available are produced in their lab and nursery in Central Florida from their extensive collection of stud plants. The rest they bring from Brazil to increase variety and novelty. Miranda Orchids, located between Orlando and Tampa on the I-4 Central Florida corridor, is owned by Maria Cristina and Francisco, both born in Brazil. Also a biologist, Cristina takes care of the lab production and the day-to-day nursery operation. Francisco has been traveling internationally since 1988, while still living in Brazil, speaking at orchid-related events and meetings. The subjects of his presentations reflect Francisco's extensive travels to study orchids in their natural environments.

Francisco Miranda will be presenting "The genus *Laelia* in Brazil (county tour)". The Brazilian laelias are shown and discussed (regardless if people call them *Laelia*, *Cattleya* or *Sophranitis*). The different groups are all discussed and most species shown in their natural habitas as seen here for *Laelia kleberii*. For the more showy and/or variable species, the most outstanding and characteristic color forms are also shown. As with the cattleyas, this is a tour through the regions of the country where these plants are found, and as the result, we see some of the most beautiful areas of Brazil.

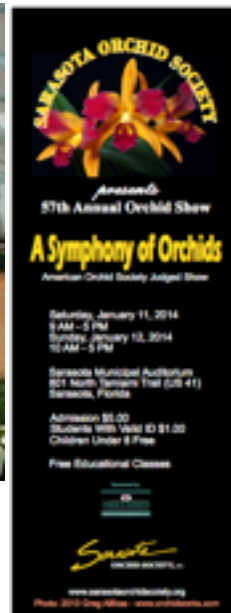

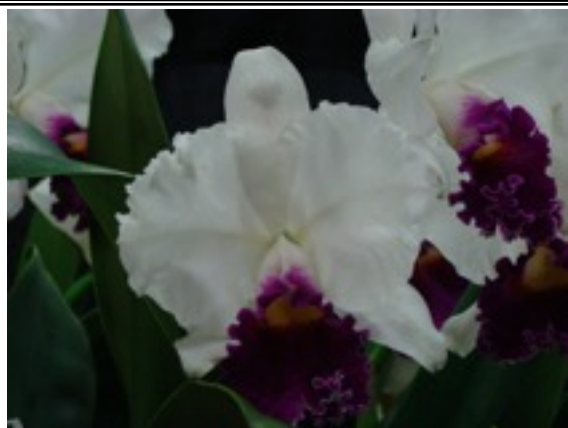

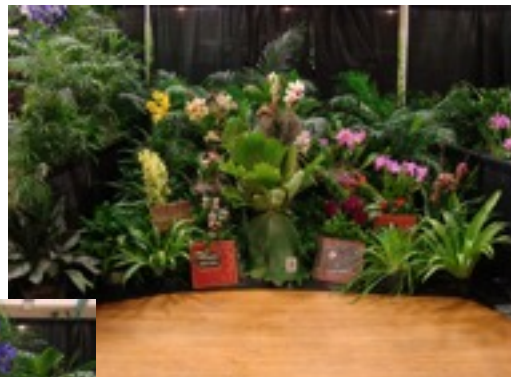

**SOS SHOW JUDGING - 2014 By Robert M. Scully**

Earlier this month, the 57<sup>th</sup> Annual Sarasota Orchid Society Orchid Show was judged by 18 volunteer members of the American Orchid Society's national judging team; several judges traveled from outside our immediate judging region to help in deciding which plants/flowers were the best among all those entered in the scheduled classes and finally, throughout the exhibition itself. The mechanics for organizing the competition remain relatively unchanged from prior years; but in 2014, significant modifications in the schedule's length & structure made judging a little more complicated with the objective of helping everyone understand what BEST actually meant when viewing lucky winners, wherever situated.

In recent years, changes in orchid taxonomy, a consequence of DNA studies in the orchid family, have been the source of much confusion. And to compound the problems, the majority of orchid show schedules (the competition's categories) have not adopted current nomenclature nor have they addressed the generic name changes that resulted from the "shuffle" within the long lists of naturally occurring orchid genera. Our 2014 Schedule introduced many adjustments necessary to conform with current taxonomic and nomenclatorial standards ....perhaps the beginning steps toward the development of a schedule suited for many other areas where tropical & sub-tropical, low elevation orchids are dominant in nearby collections. While judges may have been surprised as they noticed significant changes (from the "norm"), few had any difficulty understanding the shifts. What's more, several class realignments (and their redefinition) made the competition fairer for many entrants (e.g., *Guarianthe hybrids separated from other small-flowered cattleyas*; *small-flowered Vanda hybrids separated from large-flowered vandae*) and easier to judge too!

For the first time in many years, the commercial exhibitors' plants/flowers became part of the selection process, but in a novel way: Though no entry was required for any flowering plant shown in the exhibits of Section 2: Class 4, all of the plants in those exhibits were screened by the judges to find the BEST within those spaces for just six categories: *Cattleya*, *Phalaenopsis*, *Vanda*, Slippers, Other Genera as well as the Best Specimen Plant; these categories were listed in Section 4 of the schedule. Ultimately, those selections were pitted against the corresponding category winners from Section 3 (Individual entries, which includes all of those plants entered within society displays). Ultimately, the judges selected the BEST of the Show for those several categories and new, Special Award Rosettes were placed for the top winners.

In another big change for our Show's judging, the very BEST plant in the show was designated Grand Champion by a special written ballot, using a weighted scoring system as both the first and second choice of each judge was tabulated in the final scoring. Some were fascinated by the process, but the outcome this year simply validated the weighted scoring concept which identified the winner in what turned out to be a very tight scoring. At this point, it seems that the 2015 Show may add a Reserve Champion to the Special Awards lineup as little additional judging effort would be required to determine the next-Best overall winner.

Finally, a crowd-pleasing change was represented in a photo display of all Special Award winners (Section 1), presented near the Show entry, showing each image captioned with its name, a recognition line for the exhibitor and the winner plant's actual location in the Show. At last, members, exhibitors and visitors could quickly see which plants had been judged to be THE BEST in our Show. And just watching and listening to visitors tracking down those winners provided satisfaction that the experiment had proven successful. Actually, to many it was a surprise that not all of the BIG winners were shown by commercial growers; that should demonstrate to all of us that it's definitely worthwhile to redouble one's efforts to ready the orchid treasures for the next round ....maybe to earn at least half of the top category honors. Start soon; January 2015 is not THAT far away!!
