Orchids we should all grow by Roy Krueger



CATTLEYA CALLISTOGLOSSA

In all of the orchid kingdom, there is perhaps nothing more spectacular than a full sized white Cattleya. When you cross two of the most loved alba forms the result can only be exceptional. Such is the case of this particular C. Callistoglossa cross.

Callistoglossa was first crossed by the firm of Veitch & Co. and registered in 1882, making it one of the earliest Cattleya crosses. It is a cross of C. purpurata and C. warscewiczii. All of the early color forms were layender or pink.

The interesting part of this hybrid traces its origins to a warscewiczii specimen found and shipped to England in the early 1900's, an impressive specimen named Firmin Lambeau. It was the first true alba form of warscewiczii ever found. So impressive was it that it sold in 1910 for the sum of \$5000 (\$50,000 in today's dollars).

Years later a selfing of that plant was created by Armacost & Royston and named for their head grower and hybridizer, Leo Holguin. Like it's predecessor, it was awarded a FCC/AOS in 1985.

Soon after, Holguin crossed his namesake with a true alba form of purpurata, and the plant pictured above was the result.

Purpurata blooms in May-June. Warscewiczii blooms later in the summer. Callistoglossa blooms between them, in July, and puts on a spectacular show with multiple flowers on each inflorescence. Flowers last almost three weeks, a rare feat for a summer blooming Cattleya.

The flower form has the typical rounded elongated petals of the warscewiczii parent and

the narrow sepals of purpurata. The lip is single lobed and somewhat ruffled with a typical yellow center.

Grow it like any other large catt. in well drained coarse mix. Let it dry before re-watering. Fertilize heavily when in active growth, then moderately for the rest of the year. It likes bright Cattleya light. I grow mine in the pool cage with about 70% direct sunlight. The mix is coarse bark, charcoal, and inorganic like lava rock or Sta-lite.

Since there are so many color forms of purpurata, it is obvious that there could be many color forms of Callistoglossa. The rub is, all of the crosses with warscewiczii that were made with other than alba specimens came out pink. However, if the cross was made with an alba form of warscewiczii, the color of the purpurata dominated. Thus, if you used a semi alba purpurata, the likelihood was that you would get a good share of semi alba Callistoglossas, many with the stunning purpurata lip.

An acquaintance, Fred Missbach, of Atlanta who is President of Orchid Digest had a beautiful semi alba Callistoglossa awarded in 2012 with an incredible purple lip.

Others crossed with Striata or Rubra forms of purpurata carried those characteristics.

If you like big Catts and have room for one more summer bloomer, this is a wonderful choice.

Silent Auction Guidelines:

We will limit the total number of plants to 4 or 5 per month.

By the 20th of the month, prior to the upcoming meeting, a member will email a request to Denny Pavlock (dpavlock@gmail.com) with the number of plants they wish to bring.

Include the name of the plant, the approximate number of pseudo bulbs, size of the pot, basket or mount or that it is a bare root. If you have a jpeg picture of the flower, please include with your request.

If you do not have pic, SOS will provide one, if plant is not blooming

Plants must be clean with no scale, thrips, etc. If desired, specify the minimum price you will accept for each plant.

If desired, specify an "eBay type Buy-It-Now" amount for each plant so that a member may instantly purchase the plant.

Note: The plant will then immediately be removed from the Silent Auction Table

To confirm your inclusion in the Silent Auction, Denny will send you, the member, a Silent Auction Form.

The seller will receive 75% and the SOS will receive 25% of the sale's price.

Member will receive the total amount of the sale and is responsible for returning 25% (cash or check) plus the Silent Auction Form to the SOS Treasurer at the conclusion of the meeting.
