Word of the Month - One word to learn each month:

Backbulb (bak-buhlb) An old pseudobulb, often without leaves but still alive and bearing one or more eyes, frequently used for propagation, located behind the actively growing portion of a **sympodial** orchid (Store water in pseudobulbs). We all learn from each other and learning together is more fun. (**note**: sympodial orchid vs monopodial = single upright stem such as vandas and phals)
